MATLOCK TOWN - MATCH PREVIEW

A very warm welcome to everyone to The Swansway Stadium this evening, including the supporters, players, management and Directors of our visitors, Matlock Town.

It's back under the lights for the Dabbers on Tuesday night (7.45pm kick-off) as Matlock Town visit the Swansway Stadium as we look to build on the win over Atherton last weekend.

Up All Night to Mat-Locky

Matlock have lost 3 of their last 4 away games including against teams like Gainsborough and Lancaster. Overall, their record in their last 5 matches is exactly the same as the Dabbers, 7 points out of 15. At the weekend, they secured a crucial 1-0 win against fellow promotion chasers FC United. For now, they lie just 2 points outside the play-offs but with games in hand on the teams around them in 8th place.

Last Time Out

A Jamie Menagh penalty, won by debutant Curtis Morrison, gave the Dabbers the lead in Derbyshire in October, before Reece Kendall equalised early in the second half to split the points in a 1-1 draw.

Players to Watch

There's been a bit of churn in the Matlock squad, with captain Ryan Qualter being poached last week by National League North high-flyers Scarborough, who also signed joint top-scorer Alex Wiles from Matlock in December. They've responded in recent days by bringing in Ethan Cartwright from Guiseley and Robbie McNicholas from Loughborough Dynamo, who both made their debut last weekend.

Their other joint top-scorer, John Johnston on 6 goals, got the most recent of those just last Saturday in that FC United win.

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ATHERTON COLLIERIES – MATCH REPORT

Dabbers comeback against Colls to secure a crucial three points.

Ritchie Sutton described his sides 2-1 victory against Atherton Collieries as a “fantastic victory” as they came from behind to beat fellow strugglers Atherton Collieries at the Swansway Stadium. “We’ve performed well and not took the points that we deserved, today we were under par, but we managed to get the three points at home which is fantastic and it gives the fans something to cheer about”

The game got off to the worst possible start for The Dabbers as Scott Bakkor gave the visitors the lead inside five minutes. He managed to get on the end of a long ball up field before driving into the box and cutting inside and slotting home, underneath Tom Booth to put his side ahead.

After going a goal ahead early on, Atherton had a spring in their step and came close to doubling their lead five minutes later. Colls skipper Dan Lafferty got on the end of a deep freekick but his header was easy for Tom Booth in The Dabbers goal. On the half hour mark the visitors had another golden opportunity as Jay Fitzmartin burst through Nantwich’s backline and as he got into the box, he chanced his arm but Troy Bourne was there with a last ditch tackle to clear the danger and keep his side in the game.

Nantwich Town hadn’t threatened all game, but they managed to find a leveller through top scorer Dan Cockerline on the stroke of half time. Tom Scully’s freekick was headed down by Jon Moran, into the path of Dan Cockerline who managed to bundle home from close range to level the scores and give the Dabbers something to build on in the second half.

At half time, The Dabbers would’ve considered themselves lucky to not be behind, Colls had numerous chances to score more than one, but failed to take their chances meaning Nantwich were able to get back into the game.

The second half started much like the first with the visitors having the better of the opportunities, Fitzmartin once again got in behind but his effort was comfortably saved by Tom Booth. In the 52nd minute Fitzmartin had a golden chance to put his side ahead. Bakkor found space down the left side, as he got to the by-line he crossed towards an unmarked Fitzmartin who had the whole goal to aim at but his volley from six yards out ballooned over the crossbar.

In the 57th minute, the game changed. Jay Fitzmartin was beaten to a long ball by Tom Booth before the Atherton forward recklessly lunged in on the Dabbers keeper leaving the referee with no choice but to brandish the red card meaning his side were forced to play the last half hour with ten men.

The Dabbers now had the man advantage and they almost took immediate advantage of this in the 68th minute. Adam Dawson's corner caused chaos in the Atherton box, eventually the ball landed to Dan Cockerline but his acrobatic volley went over the crossbar. Dawson was playing an instrumental role in the Dabbers offensive play, He showed excellent footwork down the left side before crossing to Troy Bourne but couldn't keep his header down. One minute later, Nantwich were millimetres away from going ahead. On loan Altrincham forward Ryan Morton did well to keep the ball on the edge of the box before he took aim but his effort crashed off the post before it was cleared way to danger.

The Dabbers were on top, but they just couldn't make their pressure count and as the time ticked down it was looking less and less likely that they would take the lead. However, In the 80th minute captain Troy Bourne beat the keeper to Tom Scully's freekick and looped a header over Owen Mooney in the Colls goal to put his side ahead with just ten minutes of the game left to play.

"I didn't really see much of Dan's goal, but he tapped it in on the line, And then Troy has a knack of getting winners so its brilliant for him because he's a lovely lad and if anyone deserves it its him. It was a great win today but we still have plenty of games left so we'll dust ourselves down and move onto another big game on Tuesday" said Sutton.

The Dabbers had a golden chance to seal the deal when Dan Cockerline counter attacked but he rushed his effort and it went well wide of the mark, Ryan Morton had made a great run outside him and the better option was probably to slide him in behind.

The referee had indicated seven minutes of added time which was probably fair considering all the stoppages that there had been over the course of the game. In the 94th minute Atherton really should have levelled the game. Substitute Bailey Thompson broke into the box before getting to the by-line and squaring to Bakkor who just had to roll home from six yards out but Tom Booth somehow managed to save with his legs as he throw himself in front of Bakkor's effort.

"We've spoke a few times about Tom, yes he's made the odd error here and there, but he's saved us so many points over the season with his ability to save crucial goals. He's saved us two points there just with his ability to save shots" added Sutton.

The game ended with the Dabbers picking up a crucial three points which lifts them up to 16th in the table, overtaking todays opponents Atherton Collieries.

MATLOCK TOWN - HISTORY

Matlock Town sprung to prominence as one of the leading non league clubs in the country.

They joined the NPL in 1969/70 and their early years in the competition saw them struggle towards the bottom of the league.

Earlier they had won the Central Alliance Division North Champions in 1959/60 and 1960/61, which saw them enter the Midland Counties League which they won in their debut season. Additionally in 1959/60 they reached the FA Cup First Round for the first time, losing 1-0 at home to Crook Town after a replay.

When they won the Midland Counties League for the second time in 1968/69 they were invited to join the NPL and they have now been members of the league for 51 seasons.

Matlock won the FA Trophy at Wembley in April 1975, beating Scarborough 4-0, then a record winning margin for the final and the only time when three brothers have played for the same club in a Wembley final as Tom, Mick and Nick Fenoughty played leading roles.

Peter Swan had taken over as manager at the start of the season bringing about a fantastic attacking style to Matlock's play. Success had come earlier in the 1974/75 campaign as Matlock progressed to the First Round of the FA Cup, losing 4-1 at home to eventual Third Division champions Blackburn Rovers in front of over 5,000 spectators. Two days after their Wembley win they captured the Derbyshire Senior Cup for the first time with a 6-1 home win against Glossop and an aggregate margin of 9-3.

Tom Fenoughty replaced Swan as manager at the start of the 1976/77 season which saw Matlock reach the FA Cup Third Round for the one and only time. In Round Two Matlock beat eventual Third Division champions Mansfield Town 5-2 on their own ground, the Stags only home defeat of the campaign. Carlisle beat them in the next round and drew Liverpool away in Round Four! The NPL title narrowly eluded them as they finished in third spot behind champions Boston United and Northwich Victoria but silverware came their way with an aggregate win over New Mills in the Derbyshire Senior Cup Final.

In 1977/78 Matlock won the NPL Cup by beating Boston United 3-0 in the final at Maine Road, Manchester to enable them to qualify for the Anglo-Italian tournament in 1979. They finished as English runners up to Sutton United following 2-1 defeats to both Chieti and Pisa in Italy but beating Juniorcasale and Cremonese 2-0 at home.

Matlock's best league campaign to date was in 1983/84 when they finished runners-up to Barrow. Their last FA Cup 1st Round appearance was in 1989/90 when they were beaten 4-1 at Scunthorpe United.

They lost their Premier Division status at the end of the 1995/96 campaign and did not return to the top flight until they finished second to Hyde United in the NPL First Division in 2003/04. In the following season they won the NPL Cup after beating Whitby Town in a two legged final.

Since then Matlock's league form has been patchy with a number of bottom half finishes, their best being a 5th placed finish in 2006/07 when they lost in the play-off semi final after extra time at Witton Albion. Witton proved to be an unlucky ground for them in that season as Fleetwood Town beat them 1-0 to lift the NPL Cup.

Their most recent honours have been in the Derbyshire Senior Cup which they won in 2014/15 and 2016/17, on both occasions beating Gresley in the final at Chesterfield 7-0 and 5-0 respectively. They have been giant killers in the FA Trophy though, beating Mansfield Town in 2012/13, Halifax and Solihull Moors in 2016/17 and Chorley last season.

MATLOCK TOWN – SQUAD & STAFF

MARTIN CARRUTHERS (MANAGER)

Martin was appointed in December 2022 following the departure of Craig Elliott to Buxton. A former Football League striker he made 503 appearances scoring 133 goals including playing top flight football at Aston Villa. He made 121 appearances for Stoke City in the First Division (now Championship) between 1993 and 1997, the rest of his career being in Leagues One and Two. In non-league he started out at Grantham town before moving to Ilkeston where he would become player-coach. He had a very successful six years at Basford United, guiding them from the East Midlands League to the NPL Premier Division. After a short spell managing Quorn he was back at Ilkeston and last season he led them to the NPL Midlands Division title. He left Ilkeston by mutual consent in September 2022.

WAYNE HALLCRO (ASSISTANT MANAGER)

Wayne joined Matlock as assistant to Martin Carruthers in December 2022. He has held joint or assistant manager positions at a number of East Midlands clubs including Ilkeston Town, Belper Town, Grantham Town and Stamford.

STEVE SHUTTLEWORTH (GOALKEEPER COACH)

Steve has become a firm favourite at Matlock with his undying loyalty to the club having stood in as joint manager when the club has been without a permanent manager. Steve has previously been goalkeeping coach at both Alfreton Town and Worksop Town.

JIM POLLARD (GOALKEEPER)

Jim joined Matlock from Grantham Town in the summer after impressing for the Gingerbreads despite their relegation from the NPL Premier Division at the end of last season. He was with Sheffield United as a youngster and then had a season at Barrow before joining Maltby Main and a short spell at Gainsborough Trinity, playing for the Holy Blues in a 2-0 win at Matlock on New Years Day 2019.

SAUL DEENEY (GOALKEEPER)

Vastly experienced Saul joined Matlock from Ilkeston Town in January 2023. He has Football League experience at Notts County, Hull City, Burton Albion and Derby County. Probably his finest game was against Manchester United in an F A Cup 3rd Round tie in January 2006 when he kept a clean sheet against Alex Ferguson's Manchester United to earn a 0-0 draw for Burton Albion. More recently he has been with Basford United, Coalville Town and Ilkeston Town.

SAM OGDEN (GOALKEEPER)

Sam signed for Matlock in July 2022 having previously played for them at reserve and academy level. He had spells at Staveley MW, Teversal, Clipstone and Hallam. He was called up by Matlock at short notice to play against York City in the FA Trophy last season.

JAMIE SHARMAN (DEFENDER)

Jamie was Chesterfield's Academy Player of the Year in 2018/19 before graduating to the first team. He was loaned out to Dover Athletic, Kidderminster Harriers and Blyth Spartans before Chesterfield released him during the summer of 2021. He had a good first season with the Gladiators last term.

MATLOCK TOWN – SQUAD & STAFF

IOAN EVANS (DEFENDER)

24 years old Ioan joined Matlock from Stalybridge Celtic in September 2021 having been an ever present in the Celtic defence during the opening fixtures of the new season, scoring three goals. He began his career at the Newport County Academy and played for both the Welsh under 17 and under 19 teams. He moved to Sheffield United and had a loan spell at Boston United before being released by the Blades. He joined Gainsborough Trinity and then moved to Tadcaster Albion before switching to Stalybridge. Dangerous in both boxes standing at six foot plus and highly experienced in the National League North, Ioan has been consistent and has shown what an important signing he was for the club.

JAZ GOUNDRY (DEFENDER)

Jaz is on loan from Grimsby Town. Born in Mansfield he joined the Grimsby Academy before signing his first full time contract at Blundell Park in May 2021. He has since had loan spells in the NPL Eastern Division at Bridlington Town and Grimsby Borough. Standing at 6'4" he is a commanding left sided central defender.

ADAM YATES (DEFENDER)

Adam is one of the club's most ever respected players having played over 500 games since making his debut against FC United of Manchester in March 2009. A true fans favourite who has collected the club's player of the year award four times and also won the players' player having also been captain. He retired due to family commitments at the beginning of the 2021/22 season but this is his second comeback when he has answered a call from the club for help due to injuries and unavailability in the defensive areas. He had a very short spell at Guiseley earlier in the campaign.

SIMON NJARIA (MIDFIELD)

27 years old Simon is a central midfielder signed from Radcliffe in the summer who began his career at Leeds United, playing for both their under 18 and under 21 sides. He later went to Rotherham United from Frickley after also having spells at Bradford (Park Avenue), Halifax and Harrogate Town. After being released by Rotherham he was at Warrington Town, Altrincham, Shaw Lane, Guiseley, Glossop North End, Halifax again and Mossley before settling in at Buxton during 2019/2020. After half a season at Radcliffe he joined AFC Telford before returning to Radcliffe at the start of last season.

SAUL MILOVANOVIC (MIDFIELD)

Saul joined Matlock in December 2022 after Matlock gained international clearance with Saul having played in New Zealand for Miramar Rangers. He began his career at Huddersfield Town playing for their under 18's and then for Norwich City where he was in their under 21's. He was at Kettering Town before his move to Miramar. A tidy and efficient player who can pass the ball well he quickly made a good impression at Matlock.

HARRISON TAYLOR (MIDFIELD)

Harrison is a talented midfielder who impressed manager Martin Carruthers when playing for Wisbech Town when Carruthers managed Ilkeston last season. He also plays for the Nottingham Trent University and has been training with Notts County.

MATLOCK TOWN – SQUAD & STAFF

BRAD ABBOTT (MIDFIELD)

Brad joined Matlock from Boston United in October 2022 and had played over 100 National League North games for the Pilgrims' under current Matlock boss Craig Elliott's management. He started out at Barnsley before being loaned out to Harrogate Town, Chester and Barrow. The Tykes released him in May 2016 and he joined Buxton, then having two spells at Boston interrupted by playing at Spennymoor Town. Brad is known as an aggressive, pressing, highly competitive midfielder.

TYRONE CADEAU (MIDFIELD)

Welsh born Tyrone joined Matlock in January 2023 after training with the club for some time. He played a key role in the Welsh Schoolboys u18 Centenary Shield triumph in 2022 and has played for Briton Ferry and Pontadarwe in his native country before moving to Port Vale where he has scored three goals in seven youth team appearances this term.

ALEX BYRNE (WINGER)

An energetic and skilful winger, Alex joined Matlock in March 2020, playing three games before the Covid-19 outbreak which curtailed the 2019/20 campaign. He began the 2019/20 season at Warrington Town but signed for Buxton during the autumn. He had previously long been a thorn in Matlock's side turning in match winning performances for Shaw Lane and Gainsborough Trinity, his pin point crosses leading to vital goals. He joined Warrington from Gainsborough at the start of the 2019/20 season. Alex scored some spectacular goals finishing as the club's top scorer last season as well as claiming over thirty assists.

JOHN JOHNSTON (WINGER)

John signed at Matlock in October 2022 from Guiseley as part of a deal which saw Callum Chippendale move in the opposite direction. A direct winger who loves to run at opponents, John has extensive National League North experience, winning titles with Salford City and Altrincham as well as playing at Chester, Alfreton Town and Guiseley. NPL experience has been with Kidsgrove Athletic.

JOROME SLEW (FORWARD)

Jorome joined Matlock in the summer of 2022 and is perhaps best known for his magnificent goal for Maldon & Tiptree in the FA Cup victory at Leyton Orient in November 2019. The pacy forward ran virtually the length of Brisbane Road before scoring with a crisp shot. During the season he scored over 30 times. He began his career at Sheffield United and actually had a loan spell at Matlock towards the end of the 2015/16 season. When Sheffield United released him in 2017, he joined Goole before moving to Chester. After leaving Maldon & Tiptree, he signed for Wealdstone in the National League before moving to Hampton & Richmond. He moved back up north towards the end of the 2021/22 season and went on loan to AFC Fylde.

JACK DEAKIN (FORWARD)

Jack started out at Sheffield Wednesday before signing a scholarship at Mansfield Town in July 2020. Standing at 6'1 he is strong and powerful and joined Matlock following his release by Mansfield in December 2022. He has had previous loan spells at Alfreton Town, Carlton Town and most recently at Barwell.

The Daniel Wilkinson Foundation is a charity set up in memory of Daniel Wilkinson who died in 2016 aged 24, while playing the game he loved, from an underlying heart condition called Arrhythmogenic Right Ventricular Cardiomyopathy (ARVC).



Dan played football from an early age and joined Hull City AFC when he was 10, earning a professional contract aged 18. Loughborough University followed where he completed a degree in Accounting and Financial Management while playing non-league football. He was an athlete who enjoyed the gym and took his health and nutrition very seriously. He lived life to the full and had so much ahead of him.

Other than feeling light-headed on a few occasions in the month before he died, he had no symptoms!

SUDDEN CARDIAC DEATH IN THE YOUNG (SCD)

- SCD is the leading cause of death in young athletes during sport and the majority of deaths occur with NO SYMPTOMS or family history.
- ARVC can be found in one in every 1,000 to 5,000 young adults - IF IT IS LOOKED FOR.
- Warning signs may include light-headedness, fainting, palpitations, swollen legs, breathlessness.
- Every week in the UK, 12 apparently fit and healthy young people (aged 35 and under) die from previously undiagnosed heart conditions.
- In Italy, where screening is mandatory for all young people engaged in organised sport, they have reduced the incidence of young sudden cardiac death by 89%.

OUR MISSION

The Daniel Wilkinson Foundation has been set up to raise awareness of SCD and to provide funding towards heart screening, defibrillators and CPR/defibrillator training primarily for grass-roots sporting teams.

Tragedies can be prevented through cardiac screening. It is vital that young people are identified and treated.
