RUNCORN LINNETS - MATCH PREVIEW

Good evening and welcome to the Swansway Stadium for this evenings Division One West match against Runcorn Linnets. We would like to welcome all the directors, staff, players and supporters associated with Runcorn Linnets this evening.

The Dabbers host league football at the Swansway Stadium for the first time since 26th August on Tuesday night, as we welcome Runcorn Linnets.

Just a Linnet

After a play-off finish in this league last season, Runcorn are a little bit off that this term, sitting 11th in the league on 7 points. However, like the Dabbers they have 1 or 2 games in hand over all the teams ahead of them due to cup involvements. If they were to hypothetically win both of those, they would be 2nd.

They've only lost once in their last 8 games in all competitions, and that was in an FA Cup replay to National League North side Chorley. After several high scoring games earlier in the season, things have settled slightly, and Runcorn haven't scored more than once in their last 5 outings, only keeping their first league clean sheet in their last match but one against Stalybridge. They drew 1-1 with Hednesford away in their most recent game.

Last Time Out

The Dabbers and Linnets have only met once before since their formation in 2006 after the demise of Runcorn FC, latterly Runcorn FC Halton. That meeting was in the Cheshire Senior Cup in January 2017, with Nantwich coming out 2-1 winners' courtesy of goals from Joe Mwasile and Steve Jones. This will be the first time they have visited the Swansway Stadium.

Players to Watch

Two of Runcorn Linnets' top scorers will be very familiar names to Dabbers supporters. Ryan Brooke played for Nantwich in that 2016/17 season when we visited Runcorn, and Will Saxon also featured for the club between 2019 and 2020. Both have 3 goals so far, along with 2 other Linnets players, proving how much they are sharing the goals around.

In goal will be Bayleigh Passant, a shrewd signing after a couple of very successful years at Marine, the peak of which saw him keeping goal against Jose Mourinho's Tottenham in the FA Cup.

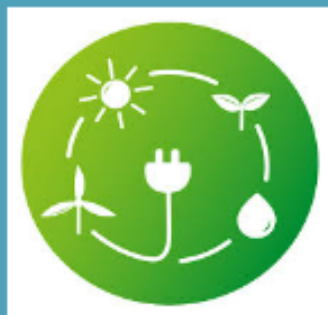

RUNCORN LINNETS - HISTORY

Runcorn Linnets were again pipped to promotion from Pitching In Northern Premier League West Division in 2023, narrowly losing its Play-off Final for a second successive year.

Linnets could indeed be described as the 'nearly men' of 2022-23 as they were runners-up in the Liverpool Senior Cup (reaching the final at the first attempt) and beaten semi-finalists in the Cheshire Senior Cup, as they had been in the previous season.

It was an eventful end to the campaign in many ways with Billy Paynter taking over as manager for its last six weeks. Billy was appointed boss in March 2023, stepping up from first-team coach upon the dismissal of Dave Wild, who had only taken charge in the summer 2022 having managed Mossley and been assistant at Matlock Town.

Things could easily have spiralled out of control with major disruption at such a crucial time but Billy called on all his professional-game experience to swiftly put things back on track.

After falling to Vanarama National League club Altrincham in the Cheshire Cup, Linnetts also found themselves up against higher-grade opposition in Liverpool FA final.

Backed by a magnificent following of 1,500 fans, Runcorn were beaten on penalties by NPL Premier outfit Marine at Widnes (after a 0-0 scoreline over 90 minutes).

The Crosby club had already edged out Linnetts in the 2021-22 promotion race by winning the Play-off Final 2-1 at Runcorn's APEC Taxis Stadium.

The 2022-23 Play-off Final followed a similar pattern, although Linnetts were this time the away side. They took an early lead at Workington, just as they had against the Mariners 12 months earlier, before again succumbing by the odd goal in three.

But this time it took extra-time to separate the teams in only the eighth match in charge for Billy Paynter.

Prior to joining Linnetts backroom team for 2022-23, Billy had worked in the Academy set-ups at Everton and Port Vale, also representing the latter as a player. He had hung up his boots with close to 500 EFL appearances to his credit, serving clubs also including Swindon Town and Brighton & Hove Albion.

He now has the job of preparing for the 2023-24 season with interest in the club at a new high. The amazing response to the Liverpool Cup final followed a 1,080 crowd for the November 2022 defeat of eventual champions, Macclesfield - the biggest attendance for a league match on the Runcorn ground.

Billy has as his deputy Jamie Rainford, who continues in the position of player-assistant manager to which he was appointed ahead of the 2022-23 campaign.

At the end of 2021-22, the club had said fond farewells to manager Calum McIntyre as he left to take command at Chester FC. His final match in charge of Runcorn had been the Play-Off Final against Marine, which took the aggregate attendance in 12 years at Linnet's stadium past 100,000. Tickets for the 1,600 sell-out final, this a club and stadium best attendance, were the hottest in town.

It was also a delight just to be able complete the season after two Covid-curtailed campaigns. In his 22 months at the club, Calum had forged a strong bond with Linnet's.

Another significant happening in the 2020 close season had involved the departures of Linnet's long-serving management team of boss Michael Ellison and assistant Matt Cross plus the retirement through injury of influential player and club captain, Kyle Hamid.

Only Matt Atherton (313) has made more appearances than Kyle's 261 with Ellison, Mark Houghton and Rob Whyte the only other double century makers. (Our appearance figures include games played in the seasons abandoned because of the coronavirus pandemic, although playing records for these two campaigns have been officially expunged).

Ello and Crossy had been in charge since summer 2016 after both playing for the club and were assured of legendary status at Linnet's on account of their on-field service and managerial achievement in bringing the club its first championship success.

They had also overseen Runcorn's first two seasons in the NPL after promotion as North West Counties League Premier Division title winners of 2017-18 - Linnet's putting the disappointment of multiple near misses firmly behind them.

After three runners-up finishes in the previous four seasons, promotion was finally clinched on April 28th 2018 on the 12th anniversary of the club's foundation. The title was secured on May 3rd 2018 with a 5-0 home victory over Blackpool-based Squires Gate. This long-awaited league crown was captured with two matches to spare and 100 points – a club record 122 league goals being scored over the 44 games with 36 conceded.

The club enjoyed a very creditable introduction to Northern Premier League life in 2018-19 as members of its West Division. Until the 2021-22 season, this was the only NPL programme, which Linnet's had been able to complete because of coronavirus. They eventually missed out on a play-off spot on goals difference.

RUNCORN LINNETS - HISTORY

For the two aborted seasons, Linnets had competed in the North West Division after geographical reorganisation. But as more far-reaching changes saw the creation of a third NPL division at Step 4 for 2021-22, they reverted to membership of the West Division.

Linnets have come a long way since being founded in 2006 by supporters of former national non-league champions, Runcorn AFC after a traumatic end for the old club. The initial aims had been to bring the successor Linnets back to Runcorn and establish the club as one of which the community could be proud.

Both these ambitions were achieved with the club still in its infancy. The stadium in the Murdishaw area of Runcorn, opened in 2010 with the project having been supported by Halton Borough Council, the FA and Football Foundation as well as the club and its fans.

Winter 2017 saw the completion of a replacement £1.4 million clubhouse as part of wider redevelopment of surrounding land with retail and leisure facilities. At the same time, pitches outside the stadium were fenced in for use by the Linnets' numerous junior teams with the club also signing a new long-term lease for the extended site with Halton Council.

Runcorn Linnets Football Club was born after Runcorn AFC had intimated it would not be in a position to field a team beyond the end of 2005-06 season. Upon leaving town in 2001, the now defunct club had suffered a troubled and nomadic existence.

An existing Supporters Trust was remodelled to run Runcorn Linnets, whose identity was derived from Runcorn AFC's nickname. The new club spent its first four years playing home games as tenants of Witton Albion FC at Wincham Park, Northwich - gaining promotion at the first attempt to the top division of the North West Counties League under the management of Steve Carragher, who had been the predecessor club's last team boss.

Victory against Formby in the NWCL Challenge Cup final in 2012-13 brought a first winners' trophy for the first team. Former Runcorn AFC player, Joey Dunn was the then manager.

Paul McNally is another "old boy" of the original club to have managed the new with Steve Wilkes at the time of his appointment being the only manager not to have had any previous Linnets connections. Calum McIntyre, Dave Wild and now Billy Paynter have since joined that particular "club".

Wilkes had in 2009 led the Linnets to their first ever final, only to be beaten to the League Cup by New Mills at Tameside Stadium, which would be the scene for the club's triumph in the same competition four years later.

Ones to Watch

Ryan Brooke

Ryan made a very popular October 2022 return to APEC Taxis Stadium, after a brief stint at Warrington Rylands. His spectacular free-kick in the home victory against Macclesfield in 2022-23 was voted Linnet's Goal of the Season by fans.

He had top scored with 34 goals in all competitions for Linnet's in 2021-22, 25 in the league earning him the NPL West's Golden Boot award and a place in the division's All Star Select XI.

Ryan is an experienced non-league campaigner, whose former clubs include Curzon Ashton, Altrincham, Nantwich Town and Mossley. He had started out at Oldham Athletic, chalking up 29 EFL appearances.

Bayleigh Passant

A summer 2023 signing, Bayleigh is in his second spell at Linnet's, his first being a four-month loan from Tranmere Rovers at the start of 2019-20, when the ink was barely dry on his first professional deal at Prenton Park.

He has since gone on to make a name for himself at Marine, famously appearing in the Emirates FA Cup third round against Tottenham Hotspur after triumphing at Runcorn on spot kicks along the way.

Liverpool-born Bayleigh also returned to haunt Linnet's in the 2021-22 Play-off Final at APEC Taxis Stadium and was again our nemesis

SWANSWAY MOTOR GROUP CHARITY WALK

Taking on the walk alongside his two friends, the challenge saw David start his walk in St Bees, Cumbria, before taking in views of three national parks – the Lake District, Yorkshire Dales and North York Moors, before finishing in Robin Hood's Bay, North Yorkshire.

Speaking of the walk, David told us;
"It was a fantastic experience, getting to meet new people and take in the beautiful views of the English countryside, all whilst raising money for an important cause."

David's most challenging days took place in the first week of the walk, tackling the highest peak and the longest day in succession. Making the 16-mile journey from Glenridding to Shap, this is saw the group take on lots of hills, including Kidsty Pike – the highest peak – a 780m Wainright. The following day saw the group walk 20.5 miles from Shap to Kirkby Stephen.

Initially setting his fundraising target at £1,000, David has been overwhelmed at the support he has received over the course of the challenge, raising over ten times what he initially set out to do. Before he'd even taken his first steps, David had received a number of generous donations, putting him at over £3,000 on the first day of the challenge. Amazed by the kindness of those who had donated, this spurred David on to raise as much money as possible, and since then he has added over £8,000 to the overall total.

CHESTER (FA CUP) – MATCH REPORT

Nantwich suffered late heartbreak as Chester scored a 94th minute winner to progress in the FA Cup at the Deva Stadium.

A largely uneventful first half gave way to a stronger home showing in the second but a spirited Nantwich comeback in a thrilling last 15 minutes.

The Dabbers were unchanged for the third game in a row and made a solid start. Elliott Whitehouse headed wide before Kai Evans curled a cross come shot that didn't cause any danger.

The home crowd were getting noticeably frustrated, partly at some of the loose passing from their side, and partly at the indecisiveness of the near side assistant referee (more on him later).

Former Dabber Connor Evans headed straight at Scott Moloney before a better chance for both sides. Steven Hewitt, who isn't afraid to shoot from range if it opens up for him, did so here and drilled it not too far wide.

Then at the other end, Chester's captain George Glendon saw a shot from the edge of the box take a heavy deflection and just go past the post, Moloney was well and truly wrongfooted.

Early in the second half, good work in tight space from Hewitt and Paddy Kay ended up with Kay bending wide off his right foot.

The Seals had a noticeably strong bench and used it to good effect early in the half, particularly when Kieran Coates came on. He created another opportunity for Glendon who again had a shot narrowly miss the target, before a scramble at the corner saw Moloney eventually claim.

They were getting closer, somehow not going ahead when a ball across the face of goal wasn't turned in. Kai Evans bent over the crossbar as Nantwich tried to respond to the pressure, but still it built. Kevin Roberts struck well from the edge of the box and a slight nick carried it wide of Moloney's far post.

Okome sliced over his own bar via a touch from Moloney for another corner, from which Chester took the lead. It was met with a flying header from Harrison Burke which was what their improved performance had merited.

But Nantwich hit back. Paul Carden switched formation to shackle Coates and brought on Connor Heath on 78 minutes.

On 82 minutes, Charlie Caton hit the side netting when he might have doubled the lead.

Then, on 84 minutes, Heath equalised. Ahmed Ali on the left edge of the box stood the ball up to the back post for Heath to head magnificently past Wyll Stanway, who got plenty on it but simply couldn't keep it out for the power. Cue delirium among the fantastic travelling Dabbers supporters.

Suddenly, it was the Dabbers who looked the most likely to win it. Heath found himself in space on the right side of the box and drew a good save out of Stanway with his legs. Byron Harrison headed over, then Heath was almost put through again but the ball just ran away from him.

At the other end came the crucial moment. A scramble in the box saw the ball squirm behind. Goal kick, corner, offside against a player who was involved but didn't touch it were the claims. Eyes turned to that assistant again, who once more inexplicably did not make a decision and left it to the referee. Throughout, it was a staggering dereliction of duty that harmed both teams, not only rendering his own place in the game pointless but making the referee's job significantly harder.

A corner was given, by the referee. And it provided the winning goal, after not quite being cleared it dropped for Caton to slam in in the final of the 4 added minutes.

The end of the cup run for the Dabbers, then. But a run full of brilliant moments, the late winner in the replay at Shifnal, the performance and team goal against Banbury and the elation of Heath's equaliser here when those with green hearts could dare to dream once more.

Other than feeling light-headed on a few occasions in the month before he died, he had no symptoms!

SUDDEN CARDIAC DEATH IN THE YOUNG (SCD)

- SCD is the leading cause of death in young athletes during sport and the majority of deaths occur with NO SYMPTOMS or family history.
- ARVC can be found in one in every 1,000 to 5,000 young adults - IF IT IS LOOKED FOR.
- Warning signs may include light-headedness, fainting, palpitations, swollen legs, breathlessness.
- Every week in the UK, 12 apparently fit and healthy young people (aged 35 and under) die from previously undiagnosed heart conditions.
- In Italy, where screening is mandatory for all young people engaged in organised sport, they have reduced the incidence of young sudden cardiac death by 89%.

OUR MISSION

The Daniel Wilkinson Foundation has been set up to raise awareness of SCD and to provide funding towards heart screening, defibrillators and CPR/defibrillator training primarily for grass-roots sporting teams.

Tragedies can be prevented through cardiac screening. It is vital that young people are identified and treated.

BRADFORD PA (FA TROPHY) – MATCH REPORT

Nantwich Town are through to the First Round Proper of the FA Trophy after a dramatic win on penalties following a goalless draw with Bradford (Park Avenue).

In the first ten minutes, a quick Avenue corner caught the Dabbers napping, Scott Moloney was forced into a save with his feet.

Brad Dockerty almost split the Dabbers backline but his run through was ultimately stopped by Moloney who was alert off his line to claim.

It was a very stop/start first half, the referee happy to blow for a foul for a lot of minor things. The plentiful free kicks provided most of the action; one from Hewitt was curled across the defensive line but the flag went up for offside as the returning Dylan Thompson tried to force it in.

The best chances for both sides came in bursts of a couple. The Dabbers had opportunities first through Connor Heath shooting at George Sykes-Kenworthy from a narrow angle, Kai Evans saw his rebound blocked and Ahmed Ali could only shoot straight at the keeper.

Byron Harrison shot over after receiving the ball with his back to goal in the box, then it was Bradford PA's turn to have chances in quick succession.

A deflected cross from the left looped over Moloney but was cleared by the Dabbers, not fully though as a shot came in and was blocked.

A PA FK was nearly OK for the lead but Ahmed Ali was sharp to slice a clearance away just before the end of a largely forgettable first half.

The second half was much the same. A Lewis Hey cross hit substitute Harry Colville in good space and bounced to Moloney rather than him taking a shot. A couple of half chances also came for Bradford via a cross that was not turned in and some good skill from Brad Dockerty which was wasted as he fired a shot over the bar.

Paul Carden said afterwards that he felt with 20 minutes go the game was destined for penalties, but there were a couple of times where that might not have happened. A Nantwich counter attack started by Perry Bircumshaw, moved on to Connor Heath and Kai Evans who went round Sykes-Kenworthy but shot wide as he was slightly off balance.

Evans later spotted the keeper off his line and went for the long range try, not getting under the ball and drilling it straight at the keeper.

Myles La Bastide came off the bench and strengthened the Avenue attack, forcing a good header behind by Joel Connolly, La Bastide heading over from the subsequent corner.

Evans came the closest to scoring for the Dabbers, shooting once again from a narrow angle but this time it looked like it was sneaking in the near post were it not for a good save from Sykes-Kenworthy; Stevie Hewitt hit the side netting at the following corner.

That was that for the action so it went straight to penalties, a recent innovation in the FA Trophy to cut down on extra playing time.

It took 8 rounds of spot kicks to split the sides. Bradford took first and scored, then Sykes-Kenworthy saved from Kai Evans to give them the early advantage.

In the third round, Moloney dived to his right to save Will Lancaster's effort, then Hewitt scored to level the shootout.

Moloney was on hand again with an even better save, from Colville's attempt, as Paddy Kay then scored to put the Dabbers ahead.

Troy Bourne had the chance to win it but a fingertip touch from the keeper onto the post and an agonising bounce past the other post meant we went into sudden death.

The next 4 penalties were scored, until Lucas Odunston blazed over to give the Dabbers match point again.

Ahmed Ali stepped up and sent the keeper the wrong way to win it by 6 pens to 5 for Nantwich and seal a place in the next round on the weekend of the 28th October.
