CHARNOCK RICHARD - MATCH PREVIEW

Good afternoon, welcome to the Swansway Stadium for this afternoons FA Cup Preliminary Round match against Charnock Richard. We would like to welcome all the directors, staff, players and supporters associated with Charnock Richard this afternoon.

After a great start in the league, the Dabbers turn attention to the FA Cup as we start in the Preliminary Round against Charnock Richard on Saturday (3pm kick-off).

It's a Char-nock Life

Charnock Richard play in the North West Counties Premier (1 tier below Nantwich). They have already won a game in the FA Cup to get to this stage, beating Burscough 1-0 at home on 2nd August.

Their league season started even before that, and they have won 2 and lost 2 of their 4 games so far. They followed up their cup win with a 5-3 defeat to Irlam but then a 4-0 win over Pilkington in midweek, in what was described on their social media as 'a fantastic performance by every player on the pitch.' They've also won a league game 5-0, making it 13 goals scored in their last 4 games in all competitions.

It's a first ever competitive meeting between the two sides. Based at Mossie Park and originally formed in 1933, they spent most of their history in the West Lancashire league before reaching the North West Counties system in 2016 and promptly winning promotion to the Premier in 2017, where they've remained ever since. They finished 12th in that division last season but won the Macron Cup (league challenge cup) by beating Stafford Town.

It's rare for the Dabbers to face another team who play in green (especially one that isn't from Northwich) but that is the case for Saturday, so Charnock will be in their away light blue kit.

Players to Watch

There is at least one former Dabber in the Charnock squad in Sky Sinclair. He played 4 games on loan at Nantwich in the 2021/22 season while a Blackpool player.

They have a very experienced head in their back line in Gaz Peet. Previously at Bury, he's best known for his long and successful period at Atherton Collieries, where he played over 300 times.

The number 9 is likely to be Fenton Davies, who already has 4 goals to his name this season as well as a pair of Man of the Match awards.

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There are many different volunteer roles in non-league football and Northern Premier League football clubs need your help with them.

CHARNOCK RICHARD - HISTORY

In 1933 the Chorley Sunday League became the Chorley Alliance League and a Charnock Richard village team was entered, but on the outbreak of the Second World War the league and team were temporarily suspended. At the end of the War, in 1945, the Chorley Alliance League was reformed along with Charnock Richard F.C. The team proved to be a tremendous success, eventually winning the league title in the 1947-48 season, losing only two games, and scoring 107 goals. This success prompted them to try and run two teams, but they ran into difficulties and the club closed at the end of the 1948-49 season.

In 1955, under the leadership of Ron Wilcox, the present club was reformed, and once again played in the Chorley Alliance League.

In 1957 they moved to the Preston & District League, where they have spent most of their time, apart from a brief flirtation with the Bolton Combination. In the Preston & District League they were soon amongst the honours, beating English Electric in 1957-58 to take the Guildhall Cup. Success also came in this competition in seasons 1963-64, 1968-69, and more recently in 1992-93. A number of league championships have also come their way, including winning the Premier Division in 1988-89.

The 1967-68 season saw the village team take the Lancashire Amateur Shield, beating Vickers Sports Club from Barrow after a replay. Further success came in the Shield in seasons 2001-2, 2006-07, 2010-11 and 2011-12.

In 1993 the club moved to the West Lancashire League, and since then both the First and Second teams have gained promotion to the top division of their respective sections. They have also been successful in the West Lancashire League, winning the Premier Division Championship on seven occasions, in seasons 1997-98, 2003-04, 2008-09, 2011-12, 2012-13, 2013-14 and 2014-15. They also won the Richardson Cup in 2001-02, 2003-04, 2013-14 and again in 2014-15. Numerous other honours have also come their way over the years including two recent Goldline Trophy victories at Bolton Wanderers Reebok Stadium, the Wilf Carr Memorial Trophy in 2009, and the Northern Counties Senior Cup in 2012-13. The Reserve team have also been amongst the honours in the West Lancashire League. Following winning the Reserve Division championship in seasons 1996-97 and 1997-98, they completed a league and Houston Cup double in 2013-14, losing only one game in the entire season. The 2013-14 season was therefore one of the best ever seasons for the club in the West Lancashire League with both the 1st Team and Reserves completing league and cup doubles. The three senior teams are now referred to as the First team, Reserve team, and Academy team. A large number of junior teams also play in the Mid Lancs Colts Junior Football League and the Central Lancashire Junior Football League, with a youth team also playing in the Lancashire Sunday Football League.

CHARNOCK RICHARD - HISTORY

The club moved to Mossie Close in Charter Lane in 1968, after playing elsewhere in the village, and the adjoining club house was opened in 1988. A new ground has recently been developed on the opposite side of Charter Lane, known as Mossie Park, which now stages West Lancashire League games, with the new changing rooms having been opened in July 2011.

Charnock progressed to the North West Counties League in 2016-17 after finishing as runners-up in the West Lancashire League in the previous season and won promotion to the Premier Division of the NWCL in the first season when finishing runners up in Division 1. Charnock won the NWCL League Cup in 2021-22 when overcoming Cammell Laird 5-0 in the Final at Chorley's Victory Park. A remarkable run of six consecutive victories, all away from Mossie Park at the end of the 2023-24 season, earned the club a place in the Semi-Final of the Premier Division Play-Offs. The play-off game was lost 0-1 at Gigg Lane against Bury on the 30th April 2024. NWCL The League was won again in 2024-25.



CHARNOCK RICHARD – MEET THE PLAYERS

Spencer Bibby (Winger/Midfield): Spencer had been at Charnock Richard since the age of 6, playing junior football up until he reached the age of 16. He was given his senior first team debut by manager Andy Westwell in the West Lancashire League and has stayed loyal to the club despite numerous offers to play at a higher level during his senior football career. Spencer has currently made over 450 appearances for Charnock, which includes 378 starts, and hopes to add to those stats in the coming seasons.

Ashley Young (Midfielder): Ashley joined the ranks at Mossie Park in early January 2014 from Eagley. He made his Charnock Richard debut at Euxton Villa in the Premier Division on the 11th January 2014 and went on to make a big contribution to the West Lancashire League title winning side in the 2013-14 campaign. He left to join Padiham in September 2014. Then joined Coppull United for the 2015-16 campaign before rejoining the ranks at the beginning of the 2016-17 season. Ashley has made over 300 appearances for Charnock.

Daniel Regan (Midfield): Former Charnock junior, Danny returned to the Mossie Park fold from Ashton Athletic at the beginning of the 2018-19 season. Danny left to join North West Counties League side Atherton Laburnum Rovers and stayed with the Crilly Park club for a season before a five season spell at Brocstedes Park with Ashton Athletic. He made his debut for Charnock Richard on the 4th August 2018 at Mossie Park in a 2-0 win over Barnoldswick Town in the North West Counties League Premier Division.

Jack Bennett (Midfield): Jack came through the ranks at Mossie Park and was a prominent member of the successful Charnock Richard reserve side that won the West Lancashire League Reserve Division 1 championship and Houston Cup in 2013-14. Jack made his first team debut for Charnock Richard on the 17th August 2013 in the Premier Division of the West Lancashire League at Eagley. However, he moved on to near neighbours Euxton Villa where he enjoyed a few years; becoming team captain. He had a brief sojourn at Longridge Town before moving on to Garstang on the 12th November 2018. Jack re-joined Charnock Richard for the start of the 2019-20 campaign and has recently taken up a first team coaching role at the club.

Gareth Peet (Defender): Gareth has enjoyed a distinguished career in both the Northern Premier League and the North West Counties League. Having had a spell with Skelmersdale United from 2010 he joined Nelson for a season in 2014-15. He then had a two season stint at Ashton Athletic before enjoying a five year stay with Atherton Collieries from 2017-18 before joining Bury 2023. He made over 300 appearances for Atherton Collieries and has won more winners medals there than anybody at the club for 50 years. He joined Charnock Richard in the summer of 2025.

CHARNOCK RICHARD – MEET THE PLAYERS

Nathan Nickeas (Striker/Midfield): Nathan made a name for himself as a junior with Leyland Tigers who operate in the Central Lancashire Junior League and in his first season with the club, 2011-12, he scored 26 goals in 26 appearances. He remained with the Tigers for four seasons scoring an impressive 54 times in his 95 appearances for the Leyland side. In 2015-16 Nathan moved up to senior football joining West Lancashire League side Croston Sports where he was to enjoy a successful four and a half years with the Westhead Road club before signing for Charnock Richard in mid-December 2019. He made his debut for the Mossie Park side in the North West Counties League Premier Division on the 21st December 2019 at Squires Gate. He scored his first goal for The Villagers in his third appearance for the club at Yokings Park against Whitchurch Alport in the Premier Division of the North West Counties League on December 28th in the 3-0 Charnock win. Nathan scored his 100th goal for the club against AFC Liverpool on 18th January 2025.

Tyler Beck (Defender): Tyler graduated through the Workington Academy. He scored on his Workington debut in the Northern Premier League Premier Division game at Prescot Cables on the 20th August 2024. Tyler spent time on loan at Padiham in the 2024-25 season. He has also lined up previously for Macclesfield after departing from Rochdale's Academy. He joined the ranks at Mossie Park in the summer of 2025.

Jordan Darr (Striker): Jordan started his football career at Chorley and came through the 'Magpies' youth set-up at Victory Park before enjoying successful loan spells in the 2018-19 season with Bamber Bridge and Northwich Victoria, following an earlier stint at Skelmersdale United. He also played for Euxton Villa in the West Lancashire League. The highly rated forward signed for Clitheroe in the summer of 2019 before joining the ranks at Charnock Richard on a dual registration in early September. Jordan scored when coming on as a second half substitute in his first game in a Charnock shirt in the North West Counties League Premier Division at Irlam on the 10th September 2019. He later scored 2 goals in his first full game for the club at Runcorn Town in the NWCL Premier Division on the 18th September. Jordan netted 20 goals for Charnock in what turned out to be a shortened season in 2019-20. He left Charnock Richard to join Atherton Collieries at the start of the 2020-21 campaign but returned to Mossie Park in December 2020. Whilst playing against Macclesfield at Mossie Park in 2023/24, Jordan suffered an unfortunate ACL injury which kept him out for the whole of the following season.

Luke Power (Striker): Luke came through the ranks at Charnock Richard and made his senior debut for the club on the 19th September 2020 in the First Qualifying Round of the FA Vase against Northern Counties East League side Barton Town. Luke missed most of the 2021-22 campaign through injury but has been a regular first team player in recent seasons.

CHARNOCK RICHARD – MEET THE PLAYERS

Mark Woods (Midfield): Mark started his career at Blackburn Rovers as a 16 year old before moving on the Conference side Morecambe. He left the Shrimps after twelve months due to work commitments but on his return to the game he joined Preston & District League outfit Leyland Red Rose. Mark was with the club when it amalgamated with Leyland in the summer of 2011 to form Leyland United. He won a Preston & District League Premier Division championship winners medal in 2011-12 and remained with United in their first ever campaign in the West Lancashire League. Mark joined the ranks at Mossie Park in the summer of 2013. Mark took over as skipper following the retirement of club legend, Andy Roberts, at the end of the 2014-15 season. He then spent a season at Longridge Town before returning to Mossie Park for the start of the 2017-18 season. Mark made his Charnock Richard debut on the 27th July 2013 at Mossie Park against Eagley in the West Lancashire League Wilf Carr Memorial Trophy between the League champions and Richardson Cup winners.

Marcus Haydock (Defender): Marcus started his football career at the Burnley academy and spent five years with the Turf Moor club before moving to Bury where he spent the next three seasons. On leaving the Gigg Lane outfit Marcus joined Northern Premier League side Hyde United in 2015-16. He was a member the Hyde United team that won promotion from the Division 1 North in 2017-18 before move to Emley where he enjoyed an 18 month spell and helped the Yorkshire side to promotion to Premier Division of the Northern Counties East League. Marcus joined Charnock Richard in early October 2021 and made his full debut for the Mossie Park side at Nelson in the First Round of the Lancashire FA Challenge Trophy on the 19th October 2021.

Fenton Davies (Striker): Fenton joined the ranks at Charnock Richard from Accrington Stanley towards the end of the 2022-23 season. He came on as a substitute in Charnock's FA Vase 4-0 victory at Carlisle City on the 9th December 2023 and made his full debut at Mossie Park on the 23rd December 2023 in the North West Counties League Premier Division against Glossop North End. Scored his first goal for the Villagers from the penalty spot in the 7-1 win at home to Skelmersdale United in the North West Counties League Premier Division on the 3rd March 2024. Scored his first hat-trick for the club in the 6-1 home win against Squires Gate six days later, in the league on the 9th March 2024.

Cameron Gourley (Central Defender): Signed for Charnock Richard on transfer deadline day from Squires Gate on the 31st March 2024. Blackpool lad, Cam, enjoyed spells with both Longridge Town and Squires Gate in recent seasons. Cameron was also with Bamber Bridge for a short spell. He made his Charnock Richard debut on the 1st of April 2024 in the home North West Counties League Premier Division game against Kendal Town.

CHARNOCK RICHARD – MEET THE PLAYERS

Ryan Hamer (Goalkeeper): Ryan was with Winsford United as a 19 year old where he won their Young Player of the Year award for season 2021-22. From there is signed for City of Liverpool after having a short spell with United of Manchester. He joined Ramsbottom United in July 2023 and twelve months later signed for Charnock Richard. He made his debut for Charnock at South Liverpool in the North West Counties League Premier Division on the 27th July 2024.

Sky Sinclair (Defender): Full-back Sky started his football career at Black pool in 2015. Whilst at Bloomfield Road he gained some non-league experience in loans at Widnes, Lancaster City and Nantwich Town. He spent some time at Atherton Collieries before joining Bamber Bridge. He joined the ranks at Mossie Park in September 2024. Sky made his Charnock Richard debut on the 14th September 2024 at Mossie Park against FC St Helens in the North West Counties League Premier Division.

Louis Holt (Striker): Louis began his football with Northern Premier League side Hyde United in the 2016-17 season. He was badly hurt in January 2017; suffering an acute cruciate ligament injury that was to keep him out of the game for the next five seasons. On recovering Louis joined North West Counties League Premier Division side Irlam in the summer of 2022 but moved on to Charnock Richard in late August and came on as a substitute at Congleton Town on the 29th August. He marked his full debut for the club with two goals at Mossie Park against AFC Liverpool in the Premier Division of the North West Counties League in the 3-3 thriller on the 13th September. He left to Join Bamber Bridge in the summer of 2023 but returned to Mossie Park in September 2024. In his first stint at the club Louis made 25 appearances and proved to be a formidable goal-scorer for Charnock netting 17 goals.

Matthew Westwell (Midfielder): Matt has enjoyed a long association with the Mossie Park side having started with the Under 8's side. He progressed through the junior set up before winning the 'double' of Central Lancashire League Championship and League Cup winners in 2014-15 with Charnock Richard's Under 15's side and topped the season off with a third trophy; winning a Lancashire FA County Trophy winners medal. The following term, 2015-16 he was part of the Charnock Richard Under 16's side that won the Central Lancashire League title. He made his first team debut for the Mossie Park side on the 17th October 2018 at Litherland Remyca in the Premier Division of the North West Counties League. Matthew then spent two seasons, 2019-20 and 2020-2, with West Lancashire League Premier Division side, Tempest United, before returning to his football roots at Charnock Richard in the summer of 2021. He left to spend a few seasons at Charnock's near neighbours Euxton Villa before returning to Charnock Richard in November 2024.

CHARNOCK RICHARD – MEET THE PLAYERS

Shay Stansfield (Defender): Rochdale lad, Shay Stansfield, arrived at Mossie Park from Prestwich Heys in November 2024. Prior to his short spell at Adie Moran Park he was with Lower Breck; joining the Anfield club in the summer 2022. He started his football 'education' in the Manchester League with Springhead and also turned out for Ramsbottom United's under 23's. Shay made his Charnock Richard debut on the 2nd November 2024 against Stockport Town at Mossie Park in the North West Counties League Premier Division.

Luca Latona (Defender/Midfielder): Bolton born, Luca started his football career with Wigan Athletic and was with the Latics Academy from the age of nine after being scouted in the Bolton grassroots football scene in May 2013. He then moved on to Warrington Town in December 2023. He joined the ranks at Mossie Park in November 2024. Luca rapidly progressed to the first team at Charnock Richard making his full first team debut on the 10th November 2024 at Ashton Town in the Second Round of the Macron League Cup. He made his North West Counties League Premier Division debut on the 19th April 2025 against Squires Gate at Mossie Park.

Luke Jackson (Midfielder/Forward): Luke Jackson arrived at Mossie Park during the summer of 2025 from National League North side Radcliffe having previously spent time on loan at Prestwich Heys in season 2024-25. Has also had a spell with Ramsbottom United.

Charlie Duke (Midfielder): Charlie is an experienced player who started out at St Helens Town before signing a professional contract with Torquay United in the summer of 2016. He had a loan spell back at St Helens Town as well as further loan spells at St Austell of the South West Peninsula League and Truro City of the Southern League before joining Rushall Olympic of the Northern Premier League in the summer of 2017. He then signed for Marine twelve months later. In season 2022-23 Charlie was on a dual registration with Macclesfield and Wythenshawe. Charlie made his Charnock Richard debut at Cheadle Town in the North West Counties League Premier Division on the first day of term on the 29th July 2023. He left to join FC St Helens in the 2024-25 campaign but returned to Mossie Park in 2025.

Ryan Donnellan (Manager): Started with his home town club at the age of 15 and came through the Charnock Richard youth system. He progressed to the reserve side in the West Lancashire League in 2012-13 and netted 31 goals. Ryan was a prominent member of the successful Charnock Richard reserve side that won the West Lancashire League Reserve Division 1 championship and Houston Cup in 2013-14 and scored a further 41 goals. Ryan made his first team debut at Eagley in the West Lancashire League Premier Division on the 15th November 2014. He became manager of the reserve team at Mossie Park in 2017-18 leading a side which went 29 consecutive games unbeaten and also won West Lancashire League Challenge Cup. He was subsequently appointed first team manager at the start of the 2019-20 campaign.

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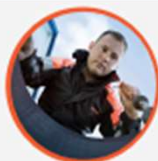

HOW DOES IT WORK?

No matter how big or small your problem feels, we are here to support each other. The 5 questions that are asked each week are designed not only to encourage men to talk, but to start to focus on the positives and on strategies to keep moving forward. There is no pressure to answer any of the questions and it is not uncommon for men to just listen for the first few sessions. The clubs all run on the same format and adhere to the same guidelines. A key principle of ANDYSMANCLUB is anything that is said in the club, stays within the club.

WHO IS IT FOR?

The club is open to any man 18 or over, who is going through a storm, been through a storm or just wants to meet a good group of people with the aim of improving one another.

ANDYSMANCLUB meet every Monday at 7pm (excluding Bank Holiday Mondays).

NANTWICH TOWN – PLAYER PROFILES

JON MORAN

Defender & Manager

20 JUNE 1997

Moran returned to the Dabbers in 2022 for his second spell after being first signed in 2015 by Phil Parkinson. Jon made a big impact, becoming an integral part of the side that went on the famous run to the FA Trophy semi-finals, knocking out higher ranked Salford City, Stockport County and Dover Athletic in the process. His performances that season turned a lot of heads, and he was bought by then National League side Forest Green Rovers in the summer of 2016. After loans at Halesowen and Weston-Super-Mare, he joined Chester on a free in 2018, and Bradford Park Avenue in the summer of 2019. That winter, he moved to Stafford Rangers where he stayed until February 2022, when his spell was mutually ended due to injury, captaining the side at times for them.

In October 2024 Jon was appointed interim manager after the departure of Paul Carden to Warrington Town. After a successful run at the start of his spell he was made permanent manager.

BEN GARRATT

Goalkeeper

25 APRIL 1994

The 30-year-old is best known for his many years spent at Crewe Alex, where he came through the academy and went on to make 246 appearances for the first team after being given his break by former Dabbers manager Steve Davis. The former England under-19 international also made nearly 100 appearances for Burton Albion before leaving at the end of 2022/23. He signed a 2-year contract in the summer to remain with the Dabbers.

PERRY BIRCUMSHAW

Defender

21 DECEMBER 1994

Equally capable at centre back or full back, Perry joined the Dabbers early on in the 22/23 season, initially on dual registration terms from Winsford United.

But such was the manner he impressed the staff at Nantwich with his performances, he was quickly signed up permanently in September 2022 and has become a fixture in defence since. He's a previous winner of the Player's Player of the Year and has now passed 100 appearances for the club.

JOSH WILLIAMS

Defender

12 OCTOBER 1999

The 25-year-old full-back was most recently at Buxton, making 31 appearances for them in National League North and getting 3 assists.

The Welshman was previously in the academies of Aston Villa, Crystal Palace and Luton, playing for the Hatters in the EFL Cup. His other non-league experience has come at Newcastle Town, Stafford Rangers, and Hemel Hempstead Town, where he made 62 appearances and scored 4 times in National League South.

He's also represented his country 3 times at under 19 level.

NANTWICH TOWN – PLAYER PROFILES

BEN HOCKENHULL

Defender

03 SEPTEMBER 2001

Hockenhull was born in Crewe and was spotted by Manchester United scouts at the age of six. He was in their academy system until 2020, when he left to join Brentford.

He played in their B team for 2 years, then after a pro contract at Tranmere and some non-league experience, ended up at Curzon Ashton.

Hockenhull initially joined on a dual reg from Curzon in March and made a big impact from centre back straight away, scoring on his debut away at Wythenshawe Town.

The 23-year-old went on to make 9 appearances at the back and signed for the Dabbers in the summer of 2025.

KELVIN MELLOR

Defender

30 DECEMBER 2002

Mellor returned this summer to the Dabbers, where he started his career in 2007. He played in the 2007-08 season for the Dabbers under Steve Davis before joining Crewe Alex as a 17-year-old. He was briefly back on loan at Nantwich in 2009, before Davis was reunited again with Mellor at the Alex and it was under Steve that Kelvin had his breakthrough into Crewe's first team, ending in two pieces of Wembley glory in the League 2 play-offs and the EFL Trophy in 2012 and 2013. Across two spells at Crewe he made over 130 appearances.

He has vast EFL experience across several other clubs including Blackpool, Plymouth Argyle, Bradford City, Morecambe, Carlisle, and Accrington Stanley. Now 33, Mellor had been working with the club in recent months with our academy tie-in programme with Malbank Sixth Form, and now is back with us as a player.

AIDAN ROXBURGH

Defender

27 MARCH 1999

Dabbers fans will remember the 26-year-old from his previous spell at the club in the 2022/23 season, where after an initial loan from Altrincham he came back again towards the end of that season, making 9 appearances in total.

Since then, he has played for Workington, Bury, Bootle and Irlam, for whom he played and scored in their Manchester Premier Cup final victory last season.

DANIEL APANTAKU

Defender

29 DECEMBER 2004

The young defender started out in Irish football with Cobh Ramblers, and made his first steps into English football with Newcastle Town last season. Signed for the Dabbers after a successful trial period.

PADDY KENNEDY

Defender

02 FEBRUARY 2004

The 21-year-old played for the Dabbers as a trialist in the pre-season of 2024 but saw that period cut short by injury, before joining later in the summer. Kennedy was at Litherland REMYCA in the North West Counties Premier for the two seasons before that and captained them in 23/24.

JOEL CONNOLLY

Midfielder

19 NOVEMBER 2002

The 22-year-old is a product of the Burnley youth academy, making it to their under 21s before being released.

He then joined Prescot and made 14 appearances for them before joining the Dabbers for the run-in to the end of the 2022/23 season and beyond. He was appointed vice captain in the summer of 2025.

JOE ROBBINS

Midfielder

20 FEBRUARY 2002

The 22-year-old rejoined the Dabbers in October 2024, having previously been at the Dabbers between 2021 and 2022, where he made 28 appearances and scored 3 goals, all those goals in one game against Stalybridge Celtic.

In between the two Nantwich spells, he has played at Ashton, Bamber Bridge, Stalybridge and Stafford.

FENTON GREEN

Midfielder

03 MAY 2003

Green was most recently at Wythenshawe Town, making 32 appearances for them last season. He scored once, and it just happened to be a superb strike against the Dabbers in March.

The 22-year-old started out in the Crewe Alex academy and was with them up to under 18 level. After being released, he went to Hyde United and made 11 appearances in the 21/22 season.

He scored 6 goals for 1874 Northwich in his spell there before being signed by Leek Town for their NPL West title winning season part of the way into 2023/24, making 28 appearances.

NANTWICH TOWN – PLAYER PROFILES

BYRON MOORE

Midfielder

24 AUGUST 1988

Moore is best known for his long spell at hometown club Crewe Alex, where across 7 years he made nearly 300 appearances and scored over 30 goals, the most famous of which being the game clinching goal in 2012's League 2 play-off final win over Cheltenham. He now reunites with Kelvin Mellor, who was also in the squad that day, and another former Crewe teammate in Ben Garratt.

After Crewe, he had spells at Port Vale, Bristol Rovers, Bury and Plymouth in the EFL between 2014 and 2021.

He dropped into non-league with Torquay, before signing for AFC Telford under former Dabbers manager Paul Carden. Moore made over 100 appearances for Telford, the final one being another play-off win against Kettering at the end of last season.

PADDY JARRETT

Midfielder

23 NOVEMBER 2001

Paddy previously had a short loan spell at the Swansway Stadium in October 2021, where he made 4 appearances and impressed in that snapshot, winning Player of the Match in half of those games.

At that time he was at Stoke City, and after the loan at the Dabbers he also went on loan to Telford.

He left Stoke in the summer of 2022 and made the move to Queen's Park in Scotland, playing 2 seasons for them in the Scottish Championship.

Last season, he played for Bury, making 10 appearances in all competitions and scoring once. He then moved on to Bamber Bridge in the NPL Premier and made 14 appearances for them.

Still only 23, he's now back at his hometown club where he started his football journey as a boy.

CALLUM SAUNDERS

Forward

26 SEPTEMBER 1995

Currently in his second spell at the club, Saunders has been a consistent goalscorer for several years. He scored 29 goals in 75 appearances across his previous time at the Dabbers.

He was the Dabbers' top scorer in the 2018/19 season and curtailed 2020/21 season.

Callum was most recently at Stafford, where he spent the 2022/23 campaign. The season before, he was joint third highest goalscorer in the NPL Premier with 18 goals.

Outside of the NPL Saunders made 27 senior appearances for Crewe Alexandra where he began his footballing career at a young age.

NANTWICH TOWN – PLAYER PROFILES

BYRON HARRISON

Forward

15 JUNE 1987

The 6ft3, vastly experienced striker has nearly 150 Football League appearances, the majority of which were during a successful spell at Cheltenham Town where he scored 20 goals in 94 games between 2012 and 2015. In more recent years, he also performed strongly for Barrow in the National League, scoring 32 times in 67 appearances in 2 seasons that ended in 2018, before he returned in 2019/20 to help them gain promotion to the EFL.

Starting his career in non-league with clubs like Havant and Waterloooville and Boreham Wood, he earned a move to League 2 Stevenage in 2010, before spending time at AFC Wimbledon and Chesterfield as well as that run with Cheltenham.

In 2018, he returned to non-league, and has played for teams such as Sutton, Barnet and most recently Altrincham. He was the Dabbers' top scorer and Player of the Season in 2023/24.

ALEX PANTER

Forward

09 DECEMBER 2001

The 23-year-old forward has been on somewhat of a meteoric rise over the last year or so. Up to the end of 2023/24 he was at Poynton in the Cheshire League, scoring 20 goals as they won 3 trophies.

That earned him a move into the North West Counties system with Maine Road (10th tier). The step up didn't seem to faze him at all. Between July and November 2024 he scored 11 goals and set up 4 more in 23 appearances.

This caught the attention of Wythenshawe Town, who he made 9 appearances for after joining in November. He then joined the Dabbers in January 2025.

BEN GREENOP

Forward

01 AUGUST 1997

The 28-year-old was most recently at Sandbach United, where he scored 24 goals in 39 games in all competitions last season.

In youth football he was on the books of Manchester United. He's also spent time at Preston North End, Chester, Witton and Ashville, for whom he played for 3 years and scored 15 goals in 23/24, also at North West counties level.

RUI CLARKE-PHILLIPS

Forward

05 JANUARY 2008

The young 17 year old forward, joined Nantwich Town last season with the new U21 squad, after his release from Wrexham. He also plays within the Tranmere Rovers youth setup.

Rui has already impressed in pre-season with a handful of appearances and is hoping to make an impression in competitive matches for the upcoming season.



The Daniel Wilkinson Foundation is a charity set up in memory of Daniel Wilkinson who died in 2016 aged 24, while playing the game he loved, from an underlying heart condition called Arrhythmogenic Right Ventricular Cardiomyopathy (ARVC).



Dan played football from an early age and joined Hull City AFC when he was 10, earning a professional contract aged 18. Loughborough University followed where he completed a degree in Accounting and Financial Management while playing non-league football. He was an athlete who enjoyed the gym and took his health and nutrition very seriously. He lived life to the full and had so much ahead of him.

Other than feeling light-headed on a few occasions in the month before he died, he had no symptoms!

SUDDEN CARDIAC DEATH IN THE YOUNG (SCD)

- SCD is the leading cause of death in young athletes during sport and the majority of deaths occur with NO SYMPTOMS or family history.
- ARVC can be found in one in every 1,000 to 5,000 young adults - IF IT IS LOOKED FOR.
- Warning signs may include light-headedness, fainting, palpitations, swollen legs, breathlessness.
- Every week in the UK, 12 apparently fit and healthy young people (aged 35 and under) die from previously undiagnosed heart conditions.
- In Italy, where screening is mandatory for all young people engaged in organised sport, they have reduced the incidence of young sudden cardiac death by 89%.

OUR MISSION

The Daniel Wilkinson Foundation has been set up to raise awareness of SCD and to provide funding towards heart screening, defibrillators and CPR/defibrillator training primarily for grass-roots sporting teams.

Tragedies can be prevented through cardiac screening. It is vital that young people are identified and treated.
